Comparing and Contrasting

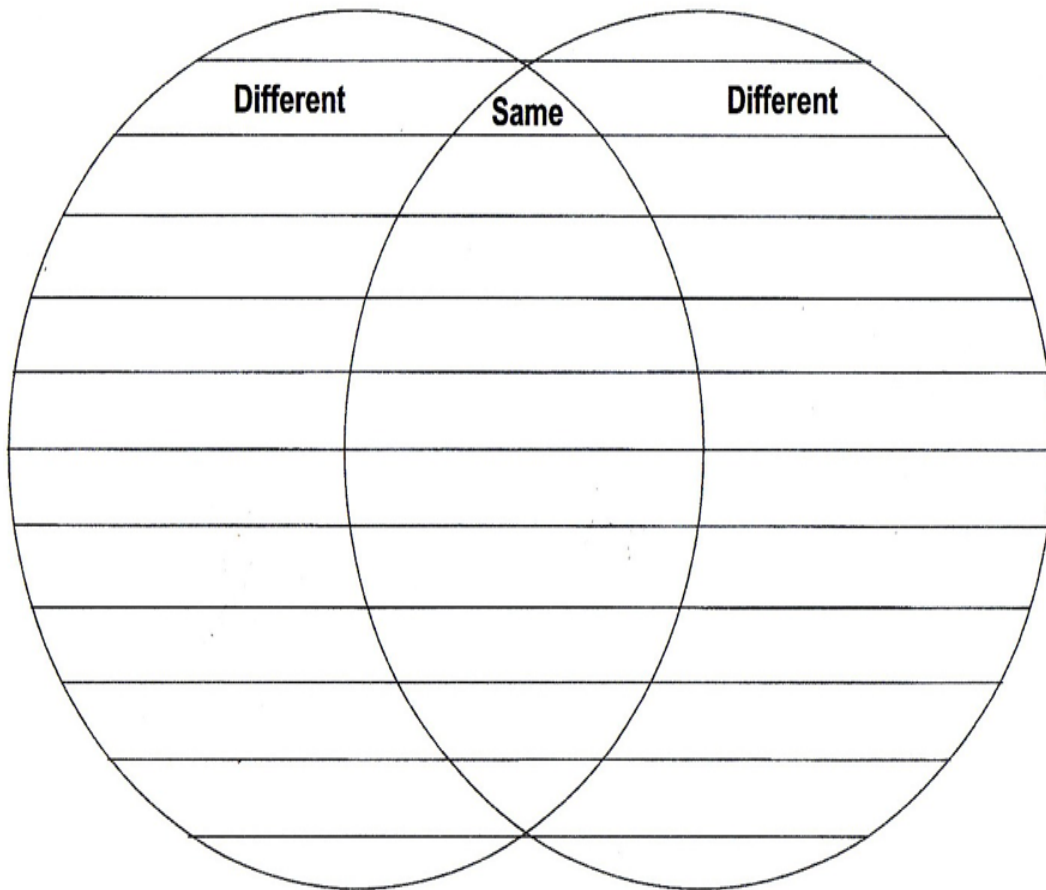

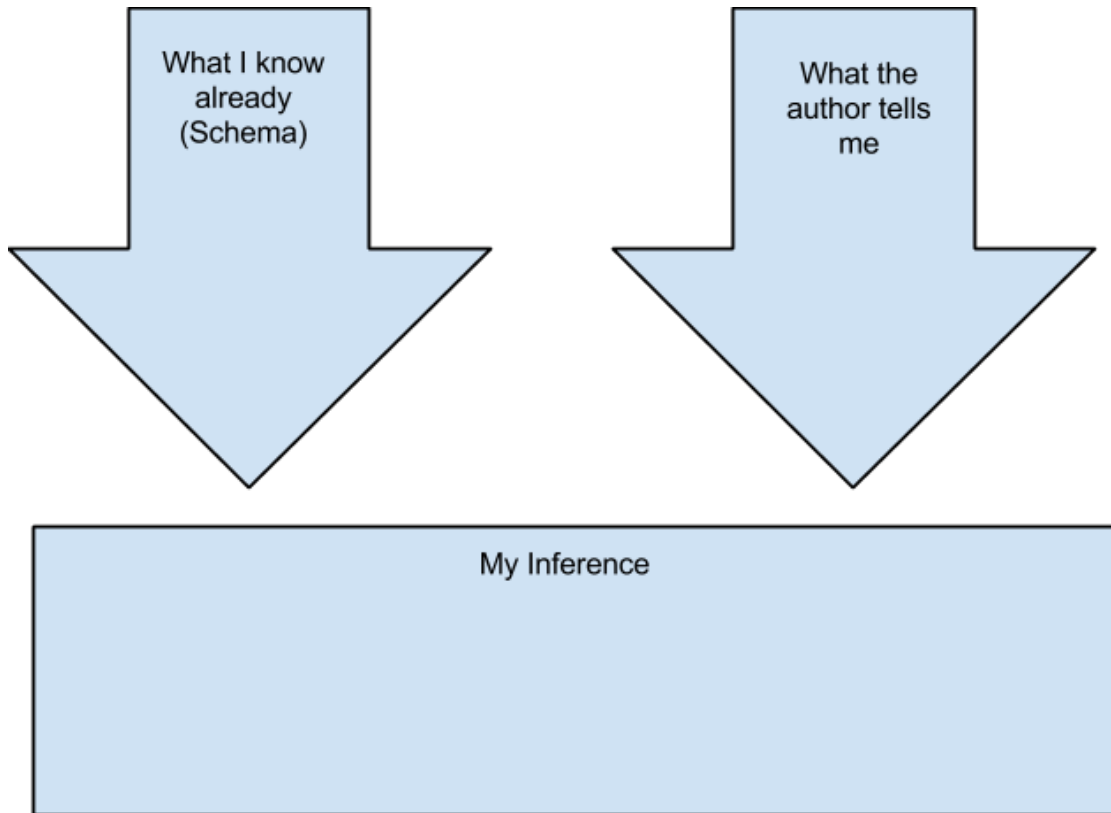
Making an Inference

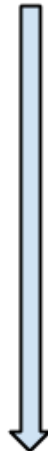


